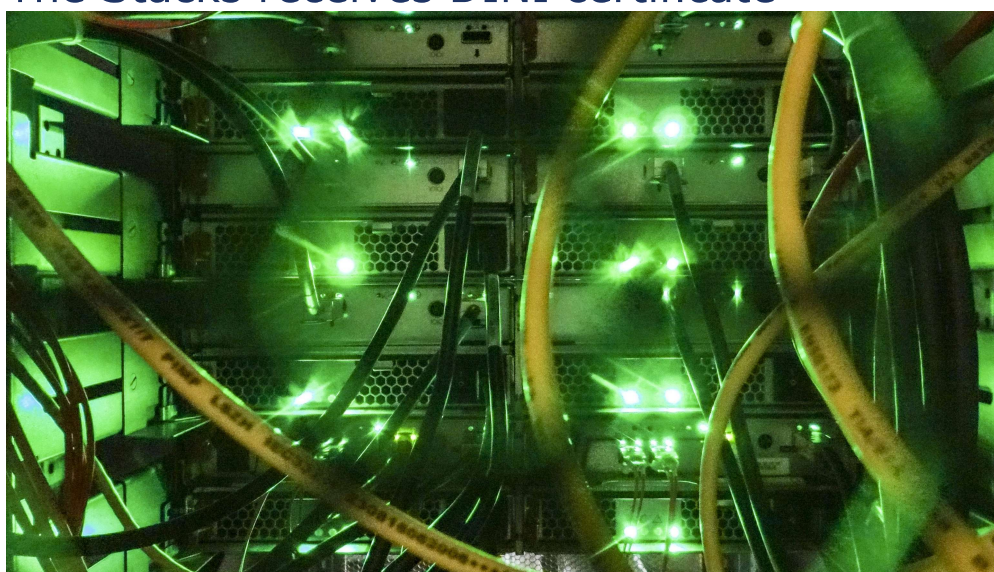

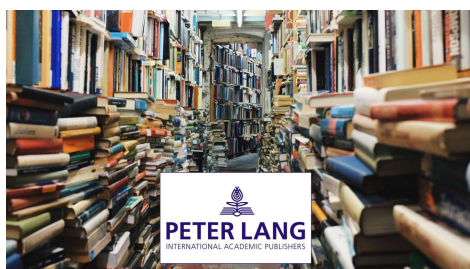

## The Stacks receives DINI certificate

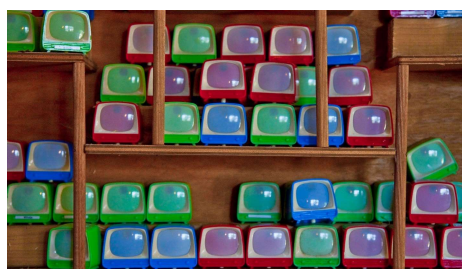

This certificate, which is awarded by the German Initiative for Network Information (Deutschen Initiative für Netzwerkinformation e.V., DINI), is continuously updated and thus a hallmark of excellence for reliable digital infrastructures. Based on a detailed catalogue of criteria that defines minimum requirements, best practices, and technical directives, the DINI certificate contributes to the advancement and standardization of Open Access publication services and repositories.
